Education and learning

The availability of good, accessible, affordable services to help all ages to make the most of education and learning opportunities.

Health

Access to good quality public, voluntary, and social care services that promote physical and mental health within the community.

Economy, work and employment

Ensuring services and infrastructure promote a prosperous, sustainable, ethical, inclusive economy that meets the needs of the local people.

Place

Culture, heritage and leisure

Access to affordable and inclusive cultural and leisure services that celebrate the diverse histories of people in the community.

Transport, mobility and connectivity

Access to affordable and sustainable transport and communication networks for everyone, especially those with disabilities.

Housing, space and environment

Provision of affordable, secure, quality housing, and a safe, clean environment with accessible and inclusive public spaces for all ages.

Relationships

Relationships and trust

The state of family, social and community relationships and the impact of any breakdown in trust on issues like crime.

Equality

The existence of equal and fair opportunities, ensuring services and infrastructure promote equality, equity and fairness for all minority groups.

Voice and participation

Ensuring that democratic mechanisms allow people to express themselves and take individual or collective action to improve the local community.
